

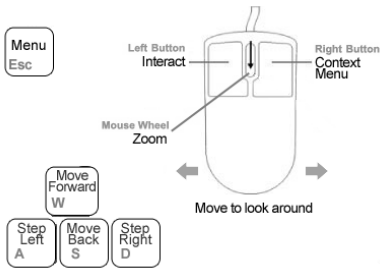
web.alive quick-start

overview

Start by navigating to a web.alive site in your browser and allow the web.alive plug-in to install. Once installation is complete, the page will refresh and web.alive will start.

essential controls

Navigate by clicking on web.alive and moving your mouse to look around. Hold down the 'W' key to walk in the direction you are looking.



When you see a hand cursor, click to interact with the object under the cursor. Many objects also support additional options through a right click menu. Hit the Escape key to get your mouse cursor and interact with other applications.

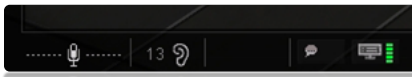
Voice is always enabled –speak into your microphone to talk to other users. You will sound much better to other users if you use a USB headset, but any microphone and speaker combination will work.

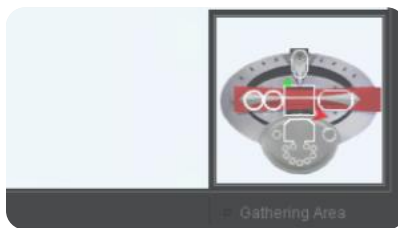
heads up display

Indicators around the edges of web.alive provide additional information.



The bottom left shows your microphone state, how many people can hear you, if you have received any text messages, and your current voice quality.

Mini-map



The bottom right shows the name of the room you are in and a map of the area.

sharing information

web.alive environment's include display areas for documents, images, videos, web pages, and desktop sharing. You can drag and drop your media onto the display area or right click and select "upload". The right click menu also provides controls to manipulate documents.

Auditoriums typically supply a "teleprompter" so that you can look at your audience and still see and control your media.



You can send documents to other users by right clicking and selecting "send file." URLs can be sent by pasting them into text chat.
